Inlaid wooden chest of drawers, linen curtains that filter the light... A room that exudes happiness.

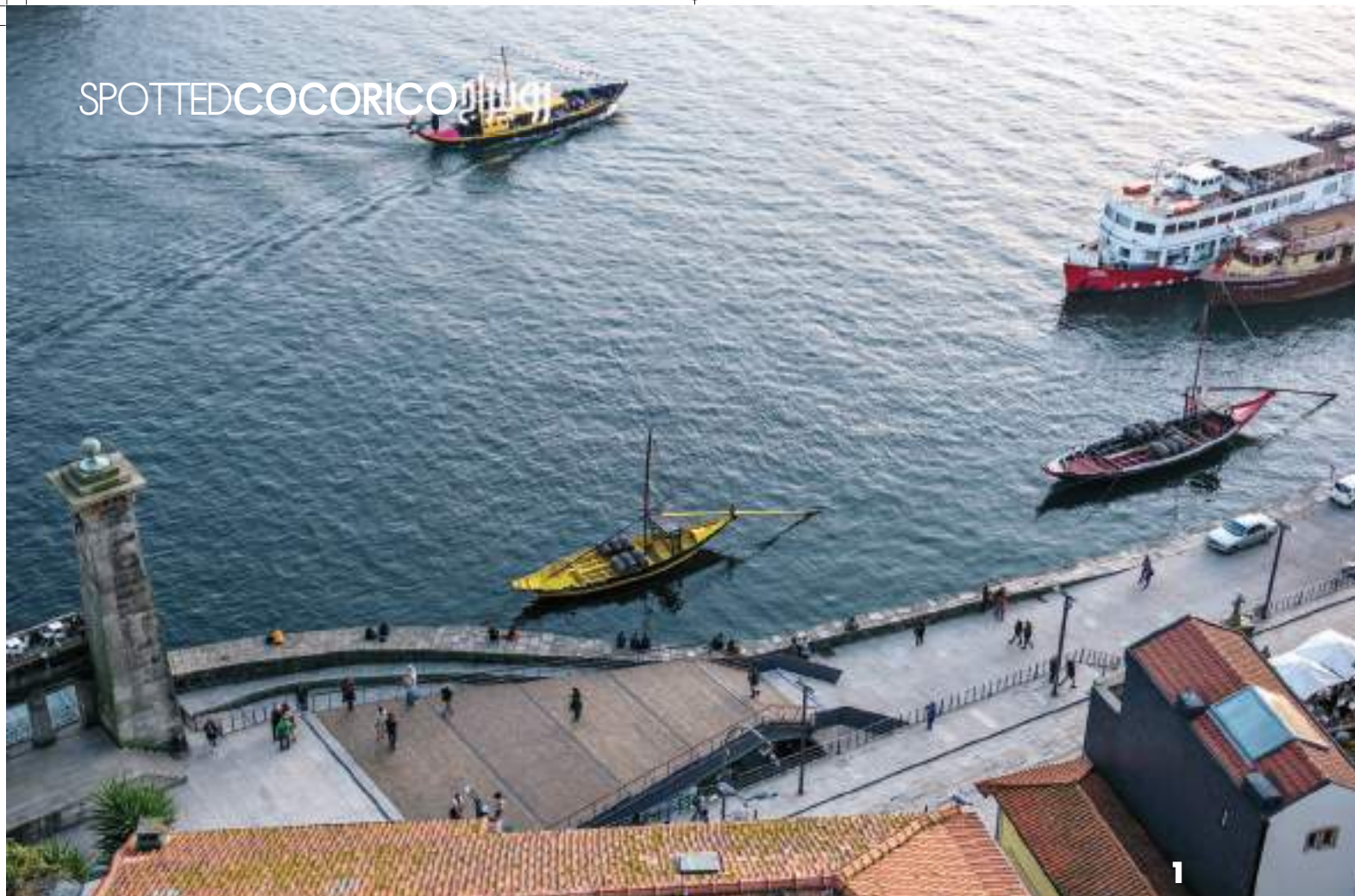
2. Inspired bathrooms

Two twin hotels. Cocorico can be considered as the diamond of the Millésime group whose aim is to revive places steeped in history to transform them into art of living houses. Opened in the summer of 2018, it took three years for Alexandra Patek and Philippe Monnin, the founding partners, to find these two former twin mansions of old Porto and bring them together in a single house, Cocorico, of more than 1,000m². A charming hotel that celebrates the history of friendship between France and Portugal.

Decorative wink. The two nations are here intimately linked through a mesh of materials with both Portuguese and French origins for a never ending journey between the two countries. With the funicular, the hotel is a five-minute walk from this iron bridge built by the disciple of Gustave Eiffel. From there we overlook spectacular views of Porto, the Douro and Vila Nova de Gaia.

Huge linen curtains gently filter the light and the height of the ceilings brings unparalleled serenity. The bathrooms are not to be outdone, ironwork, tiles and faucets... everything competes to make them showcases art of living.

Belle Helene poached pear and profiteroles to gently finish a coq au vin or a dish of local fish.

Brewery spirit

The deco and menu display a chic brasserie ambiance. The colours and the staging are particularly successful here.

Fado evenings, Italian Baroque music... liven up dinner concerts around a French menu with Portuguese accents by Flora Micoula. In the spotlight, simple seasonal foods with octopus, fish soups and a specialty, the coq au vin, a tribute to the logo of the house that showcases the love between the French rooster and the Barcelos rooster. Dishes simmered by the talented chef Antoine Coutier who brings a personal touch to each recipe.
